Who we are?

We're an independent charity that gives people the power to speak up and stop crime – 100% anonymously.

We believe everyone has the right to feel safe from crime, wherever they live.

What we do

We run a unique online reporting form and 24/7 telephone service which allows the public to remain 100% anonymous when giving crime information.

How we do it

Whether you call or use our online form we won't ask for any personal details.

We'll ask you questions which could help solve crimes but we don't want to know your name and won't even record whether you're male or female.

Staying anonymous on the phone

- We can't see your phone number.
- Your call is never recorded.
- The telephone line is scrambled so it is impossible to redial or track the source of your call.
- The call doesn't show up on your phone bill.

Staying anonymous online

- We don't ask for any personal details.
- Your IP address is scrambled so we won't know what device sent us the information.
- Our form will ask you different questions depending on the crime type you have information on.

We are an independent charity that guarantees your anonymity. We will never know who you are.

Be a Stopper

If you witnessed, or have information in relation to, domestic abuse, speak up and tell us what you know.

You will remain 100% anonymous we won't even know who you are. Simply call our freephone on 0800 555 111 or tell us what you know online at crimestoppers-uk.org.

Does my information really make a difference?

Yes – information from Crimestoppers has saved lives, stopped abuse, bought peace to families and helped bring people to justice too.

We will pass on information to the relevant police force who, with partners, may be able to intervene away from the abuser to check the potential victim is OK.

Will you know who I am?

Crimestoppers never knows who you are. Which means we can never tell law enforcement who you are. This means you are 100% anonymous and will never be called to testify.

What is domestic abuse?

Domestic abuse is behaviour from a family member, partner or expartner that is controlling, coercive, threatening, violent or abusive, and happens between people aged over 16.

It can happen to both men and women, and includes the following types of abuse: psychological, physical, sexual, financial and emotional.

Are you a victim of domestic abuse?

Due to our anonymity guarantee, we can't take information from victims of crime. In an emergency, always call 999. If it's not an emergency and you don't want to call the police, contact the 24hr freephone National Domestic Abuse Helpline (run in partnership between Women's Aid and Refuge) on 0808 2000 247 available 7 days a week.
